- **New teachers** - We would like to add two more teachers to our staff next year. Pray that the Lord would bring us the right candidates.

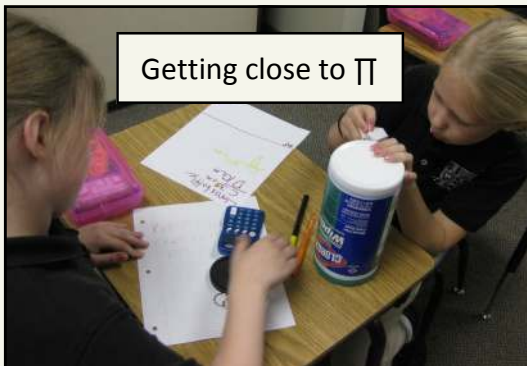
CELEBRATE PI! (WITH SOME PIE)

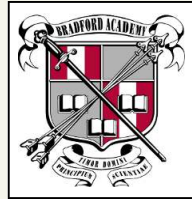
4th grade Art: Performance assessments on "The Rose", "The Koala, " and "Cylinders"

4th Math: Working with decimals, percentages, and multiplying and equivalent fractions.

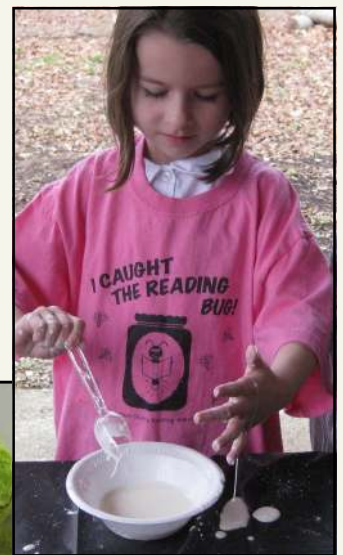
3rd Latin: *LfC A* - Ch. 23— Review
