# From the Teacher's Desk

#### <u>Kindergarten</u>

**Math:** Writing numbers using words; identifying pairs; covering a design with geometric shapes and recording on a graph; ordinal numbers to 26th, corresponding to the alphabet.

**Phonics:** Short "o" in the middle of words. Began *Pepin the Not-Big.* Discussed Pepin (really called Pepin the Short) who was the father of Charlemagne (who was exceedly tall).

**History:** Ministry of Christ; finished *One Wintry Night* by Ruth Bell Graham.

**Music:** Did hand games to practice rhythm; introduced songs for Grandparents' Day and NC Symphony visit.

**Art:** Talked about how symmetry makes art beautiful; created symmetrical Christmas trees and snowflakes.

**P.E.:** Sharpening our throwing skills using soccer balls and hula hoops.

Science: None this week due to Christmas party.

Hymn: Angels from the Realms of Glory

Verse: Isaiah 9:6-7 and verse review.

### 1ST GRADE

**Math:** This was a very exciting week in first grade! The long awaited 100 fact sheet has arrived. The students have done a great job adjusting to increased amount of problems and seem to be enjoying the challenge. We also worked on fractions and adding two-digit numbers using a variety of methods. **The next math test will on 1/10/14.**
