MR. JOHNSTON (3RD GRADE)

Math: This week we continued to practice two important new skills, LONG DIVISION and mixed numbers and improper fractions. We also learned polygons and worked on division by 6 facts.

Reading: The students have continued in to *Detectives in Togas*, an exciting mystery set in Imperial Rome.

History: Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Christ

PE: Ultimate Frisbee

Grammar: This week we continued our study of linking verbs, predicate nouns, and predicate adjectives, while also learning about figurative language, especially similes and metaphors.

Latin: Chapter 21: The Imperfect Tense of Sum.

Writing: We reviewed the students' stories (especially focusing on their conversation punctuation), and they began their final drafts

Science: This week we continued studying Newton's three laws of motion by experimenting with weight, gravity, and mass.
