soul, and sing of him who died for thee!" It warms my heart to listen to the children express the glorious reality...

His reign shall know no end, and round his pierced feet fair flowers of paradise extend their fragrance ever sweet.

We live lives that are far too common to neglect these musical treasures! Our fathers have passed down to us a rich body of emotional expressions of life transforming truth. 
4<sup>th</sup> grade Art: Review of hollow cubes

**Math:** Counting on, adding 0, Addition and Subtraction facts.

**Phonics:** Kindergarten focused on reading and handwriting this week. We also played hear the sound games to differentiate the sound of vowels.

**Centers:** Reading Corner, computer math games, handwriting, Wrap-Ups.

Science: Field Trip

**History:** B.C. History Fact Song vs. 1-7. Kindergarten was introduced to Greek history.

**Art** (**K/1**<sup>st</sup>): 3D art; Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade made paper masks that represented animals, somewhat like the wooden masks made in Africa.

Music ( $K/1^{st}$ ): Rhythm and Tempo; Kindergarten and  $1^{st}$  grade learned to sing and rhyme using rhythm and tempo.

**P.E.** (K/1<sup>st</sup>): Combining physical skills (ex: hop, jump, hop). Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade had a relay competition using skills such as jump, hop, leap, gallop and run.

Be sure to invite friends and family and mention the evening to anyone who may be interested in the school. If your church would be willing to post a flyer please let us know.


