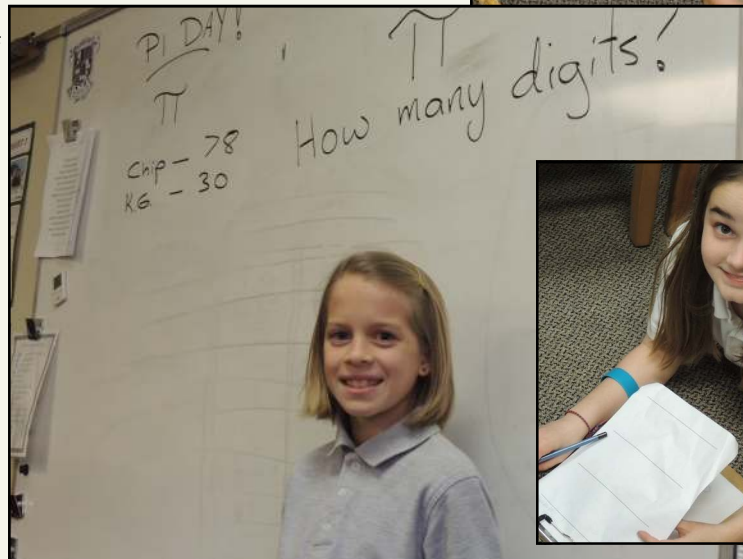
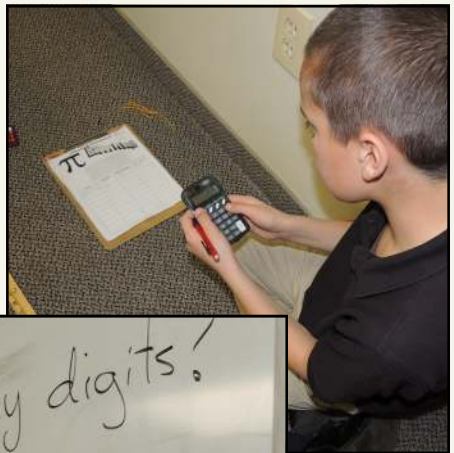
WONDERFUL PI



Thursday was the official day to get excited about MATH! It is the most special day for math guys everywhere. That's right, PI DAY, in which the irrational transcendental constant known as PI, is celebrated. Why Thursday? It was, of course, March 14th, or 3/14. We celebrated the day by learning about the number, reciting digits, measuring circles, and eating pie (which took place at exactly 1:59:26).

We made two of the activities HOUSE competition events. The circle-measuring event involved measuring the circumference and diameter of round things and calculating for PI. First place went to one Leiden team who calculated PI accurately to two decimal places. In second place was another group of Leiden students, followed closely by Austerfield and Plymouth. The second event had the students recite as many digits of PI as they could. First place went to Scrooby's champ, Chip Thrasher who quoted 78 digits correctly followed by Plymouth's Mallory Jones, Leiden's Lena Maxim, and Scrooby's Kaitlyn Gomez. Congratulations!

1ST — MRS. HICKS:

Math: Subtracting two-digit numbers, equal grouping (basic multiplication), quarters, rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and timed addition/subtraction facts.

Phonics: Silent consonants, reading comprehension activities, handwriting and sentence structure (capital letters and end marks).

Reading: Serving in the Shadow of Death by Laura Blakey.

Grammar: Poetry, capitalization in poetry and "Mr. Nobody".

Spelling: Silent consonant word list. *Spelling test will be on 3/21/13.*

Music (1st/2nd): Vocal exercise, "For the Beauty of the Earth", "Christ the Lord" and "Great is Thy Faithfulness".

Art: (1st/2nd): Review overlapping, and spacing. Still life sketch.

History: 1st grade is learning a sound off about different facts and events in NC history.

Verse: James 1:19-20.



K — MRS. MITCHELL:

Math: Adding 2 digit numbers with regrouping (carrying); telling time to the ½ hour; dividing a shape into fourths; adding 10 to a number; counting by 10's from a single digit number - great to practice in the car! (4, 14, 24, etc.)

Phonics: Target sound Y; review of Z and missing middle sounds; target sound W; re-reading all books we've covered so far.

Spelling: test on numbers 6-10; new words: you, your, there, have, said

Music: Watched first half of Mr. Bach Comes to Call from the Classical Kids collection.

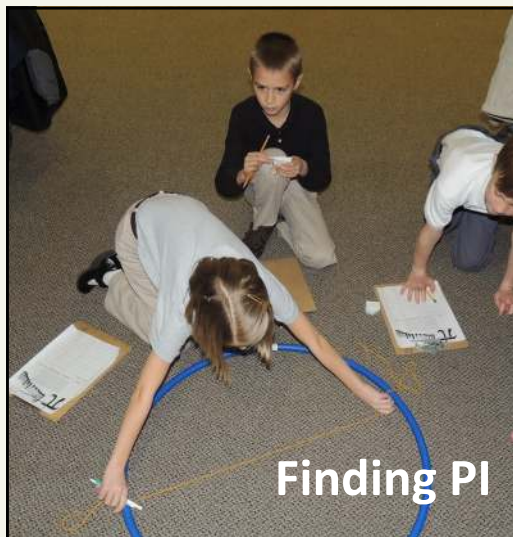
Art: Focus on still life drawing; made viewfinders.

History: Review of Feudal System and Renaissance. Martin Luther begins the Reformation.

P.E.: Review of soccer skills and focus on trapping.

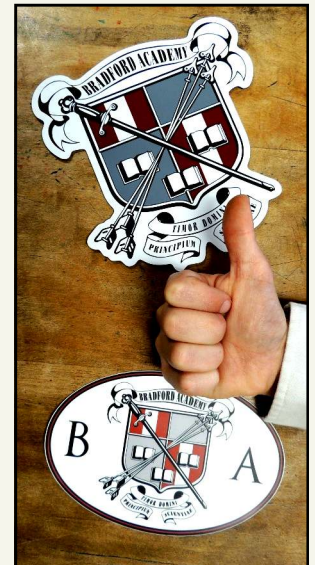
